## Wayne State University Academic Senate Facilities, Support Services and Technology Committee Proceedings from the Wednesday December 8, 2021 via Zoom

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 1:30 via ZOOM.
- 2. The Proceedings from November 17, 2021 were approved.
- 3. An initial discussion on registrations for Winter 2022. It was noted that undergraduate rates are holding but graduate rates are very poor.
- 4. A discussion on the renovation of State Hall (SH) took place with
  - Ashley Flintoff, Director of Planning and Space Management
  - Sean Campbell, Facilities Planner
  - Mark Gibbons, Construction Project Manager
  - a. As part of the planning process, they had conducted a faculty survey on the issues with SH. Over 350 responses from 13 different colleges (see attached for full details).
  - b. Among the results were flexible classrooms and collegial spaces.
  - c. They noted that the building, especially the lecture halls are not ADA compliant. In fact, they are hazardous.
  - d. They provide a full description of some of the ideas and concepts that they are planning to incorporate.
  - e. The renovation will incorporate major construction such as moving walls, removing polls, some new windows, doors that meet with ADA requirements, replacing the flooring, open space for meetings and re-envisioning the classrooms and lecture halls.

  - g. A construction manager and contractor have been appointed and is working with the Facilities team on finalizing the plan.
  - h. The building was built in 1947 with an add on in 1954.
  - i. A general discussion on ADA requirements followed. The point was made that the law only requires a minimum and that with the redesign they are the opportunity to try and incorporate designs and use to ensure that we get the maximum benefit.

- j. There was a question on cost and approvals. As noted, the Board of Governors have approved the bond issue to cover construction.
- k. It was agreed that the team would come back to the committee in February to discuss progress and other aspects of the design.

## 5. Update Canvas

- a. Based on a meeting with Nathan Cavez to discuss the Canvas broadcast email notifications, there is no way to stop them.
  - i. Each time a change is made a student gets a notification.
  - ii. The only way to prevent it is to take the class offline. Make the changes and then re-publish the class.
  - iii. As individuals we can limit the number of email notifications we receive but it is up to the individual, which includes students.
- b. Canvas is designed to be flexible. If there are 100 faculty users, then each course can be set up different.
- c. It was noted that changes to the Canvas infrastructure are limited and controlled by them.
- d. It was suggested that the OTL and the Canvas group develop a learning package especially for new faculty and students.
